

- Focus (more) on the future to (better) identify options of today
- Using scenarios to cope (better) with the complexity of integrated territorial development
- (Highly) interactive approach for ensuring (as much as possible) co-ownership & co-authorship





agglomerations:

- city centers

- tourism zones
- alpine and none-alpine peripheral zones

Results & lessons-learnt

In Austria (national level):

- Intense process with broad participation (-> mindset effects!)
- Balance between expert-driven approach and co-authorship
- Thematic scenarios could mobilise sector policies
- No real plead for "ideal scenario"
- No consensus on maps!
- (Some) "followers/multipliers"
 (e.g. on regional level)
- (Sufficient) leadership to build on results remains critical

.....for EU-level ???

- Institutional setting and process design matters!
- Balance co-ownership/authorship (> expert-driven)
- Incentives for sector policies (DGs!) to become co-owners
- Territorial EU-maps are a chance -> But: why/for whom?
- Stimulation of multiplying effects in countries, regions and relevant institutions
- Leadership +/-EC ?!
